2.5.1. Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode.

Transparency of internal assessment

The college has a transparent and robust evaluation process in terms of frequency and mode. To ensure transparency in internal assessment, the system of internal assessment is communicated with the students well in time. The basic schemes and eligibility criteria's for the evaluation process is made known to students through university ordinances, notice boards, and class counseling.

The examination timetable is displayed on the notice board at least two weeks before the internal examination, the same is circulated amongst teachers. Students can discuss issues regarding academic and test performance with the concerned teacher at the time of discussion with the subject in charges.

Students are shown the answer books of internal examination and they're seen and satisfied remarks are noted after solving grievances of students if any. If the students are not satisfied it is discussed with the concerned subject in charge and rectified. Further, any grievance of the student is sorted out by the Examination Committee and Principal.

The examination in charge along with the committee member plays a proactive role and solves the problem of the student by working as a link between the student and the university. The Internal Examination (sessional) are as per RGPV University Academic Calendar which are conducted offline mode (pen & paper) as per institute Exam policy.







Ordinance for Bachelor of Pharmacy (B.Pharm.) 4 year Degree
Programme

(For the candidates admitted in 1st year on and after July 2017)

(Under Grading System applicable on and after July 2017)

1.0 GENERAL

The Bachelor of Pharmacy (B.Pharm.) shall be a four years (eight semesters)degree programme, and three years (six semesters) degree programme for lateral entry students.

2.0 ADMISSION

The Admission to B.Pharm. degree programme shall take place on the basis of 2.1 and 2.2 as given below and/or Gazette notification issued by Government of Madhya Pradesh from time to time.

2.1 First year B. Pharm:

Candidate shall have passed 10+2 examination conducted by the respective state/central government authorities recognized as equivalent to 10+2 examination by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) with English as one of the subjects and Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics (P.C.M) and /or Biology (P.C.B / P.C.M.B.) as optional subjects individually.

2.2. B. Pharm lateral entry (to third semester):

A pass in D. Pharm. course from an institution approved by the harmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.

3.0 STRUCTURE OF BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (B.PHARM.) PROGRAM

- 3.1 There shall be at least 100 days of teaching in every semester.
- 3.2 The curriculum and syllabi of the course shall be notified by the University from time to time.
- 3.3 Course Description: Course description shall consists of:
 - i. Course Code
 - II. Title of the Course
 - iii. Credits in the form of L-T-P
 - iv. Course Objective, its Outcome and References
 - v. Pre-requisites, co-requisites if any,
 - vi. Syllabi


3.4 The medium of instruction and examination shall be English throughout the course of study. But a student can opt for Hindi provided that the option for medium of instruction and examination shall be made at the starting of program and shall remain Hindi

throughout the program, A student shall not be allowed to change the medium of instruction and examination during the course.

4.0 ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

- All students must attend every lecture, tutorial and practical class. However, to account for late registration, sickness or other such contingencies, the attendance requirement will be a minimum of 80 % of the classes. Condonation shall be as per the examination general Ordinance Number 12. He can be condoned to 10% and a further 5% by the principal of the college and Vice-Chancellor of the University, respectively for satisfactory reasons.
- Attendance record will be maintained based upon roll calls(or any equivalent operation) in every scheduled lecture, tutorial and practical class. The course coordinator will maintain and consolidate attendance record for the course(lectures, tutorials and practical(s) together, as applicable). Head of the Institute shall be responsible for maintaining the attendance records for the courses run by the institute.

5.0 EXAMINATIONS

- There will be one University Examination at the end of each semester. These examinations will be designated as follows:
- (a) During First Year

First Semester B.Pharm. Examination, Second Semester B.Pharm. Examination

(b) During Second Year

Third semester B.Pharm. Examination, Fourth semester B.Pharm. Examination

(c) During Third Year

Fifth semester B.Pharm. Examination, Sixth semester B.Pharm. Examination

(d) During fourth Year

Seventh semester B.Pharm. Examination, Eighth semester B.Pharm. Examination

- The semester examination will generally be held in Nov.-Dec. and 5.2 May- June in each year.
- At the end of every semester, a letter grade is awarded in each 5.3 course.
- 5.4 Project Work:

All the students shall undertake a project under the supervision of a teacher and submit a report. The area of the project shall directly relate any one of the elective subject opted by the student in semester VIII. The project shall be carried out in group not exceeding 5 in number. The project report shall be submitted in triplicate (typed & bound copy not less than 25 pages). (Breed)





The internal and external examiner shall evaluate the project at the time of the Practical examinations of other semester(s). Students shall be evaluated in groups for four hours (i.e., about half an hour for a group of five students).

5.5 Industrial Training (Desirable):

Every candidate shall be required to work for at least 150 hours spread over four weeks in a Pharmaceutical Industry/Hospital after the Semester – VI and before the commencement of Semester – VII. It includes Production unit, Quality Control department, Quality Assurance department, Analytical laboratory, Chemical manufacturing unit, Pharmaceutical R&D, Hospital (Clinical Pharmacy), Clinical Research Organization, Community Pharmacy, etc. The student shall submit a typed and bounded report of such work and certificate duly signed by the authority of training organization to the head of the institute.

5.6 .Practice School:

In the VII semester, every candidate shall undergo practice school for a period of 150 hours evenly distributed throughout the semester. The student shall opt any one of the domains for practice school declared by the programme committee from time to time.

At the end of the practice school, every student shall submit a printed report (in triplicate) on the practice school he/she attended (not more than 25 pages). Along with the examinations of semester VII. The report submitted by the student, knowledge and skills acquired by the student through practice school shall be evaluated by the subject experts at college Leveland grade point shall be awarded.

5.7 Educational Study Tour(Desirable):

For B. Pharm. Sixth semester students, an educational study tour to visit important manufacturing organizations is desirable. All students will submit a typed and bounded tour report after the study tour duly signed by faculty in charge(s).

- 5.8 The practical examination will be conducted respectively on course basis by internal and duly appointed external examiner.
- 5.9 A student shall be continuously evaluated for his / her academic performance in a subject through tutorial work, practical, home assignment, internal assignment, field work, seminars, quizzes, end-semester examinations etc. regularly, as proposed by respective Board of Studies from time to time.

5.10 Promotion and award of grades

A student shall be declared PASS and eligible for getting grade in a course of B.Pharm. programme if he/she secures at least 50% marks in that particular course including internal assessment. For example, to be declared as PASS and to get grade, the student has to secure a minimum of 50 marks for the total of 100 including continuous mode of assessment and end semester theory examination. Similarly the





student has to secure a minimum of 25 marks for the total 50 including internal assessment and end semester practical examination.

5.11. Carry forward of marks

In case a student fails to secure the minimum 50% in any Theory or Practical course as specified in 5.10, then he/she shall reappear for the end semester examination of that course. However his/her marks of the Internal Assessment shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.

5.12.Improvement of internal assessment

A student shall have the opportunity to improve his/her performance only once in the Sessional examination component of the internal assessment. The re-conduct of the Sessional examination shall be completed before the commencement of next end semester theory examinations.

5.13 Re-examination of end semester examinations

Re-examination of end semester examination shall be conducted as per the schedule notified by the university from time to time.

5.14. Academic Progression

No student shall be admitted to any examination unless he/she fulfills the norms given in 4.1.

Academic progression rules are applicable as follows:

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of I, II and III semesters till the IV semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of V semester until all the courses of I and II semesters are successfully completed.

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of III, IV and V semesters till the VI semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of VII semester until all the courses of I, II, III and IV semesters are successfully completed.

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of V, VI and VII semesters till the VIII semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to get the course completion certificate until all the courses of I, II, III, IV, V and VI semesters are successfully completed.


A student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of I to VIII semesters within the stipulated

time period as per the norms specified in 11.

A lateral entry student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of III, IV and V semesters till the VI semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of VII semester until all the courses of III and IV semesters are successfully completed.

A lateral entry student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of V, VI and VII semesters till the VIII semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to get the course completion certificate until all the courses of III, IV, V and VI semesters are successfully completed.

A lateral entry student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of III to VIII semesters within the stipulated time period as per the norms specified in 8.

Any student who has given more than 4 chances for successful completion of I / III semester courses and more than 3 chances for successful completion of II / IV semester courses shall be permitted to attend V / VII semester classes ONLY during the subsequent academic year as the case may be. In simpler terms there shall NOT be any ODD BATCH for any semester.

Note: Grade AB should be considered as failed and treated as one head for deciding academic progression. Such rules are also applicable for those students who fail to register for examination(s) of any course in any semester.

6 AWARD OF GRADES

6.1 Sessional Examination:

Two Sessional examinations shall be conducted for each theory / practical course as per the schedule fixed by the college(s). The scheme of question paper for theory and practical Sessional examinations is given below. The preparation of Sessional Question paper will be responsibility of respective college(s). The average marks of two Sessional examinations shall be computed for internal assessment as per the requirements.

Sessional examination shall be conducted for 30 marks for theory and shall be computed for 15 marks. Similarly, Sessional examination for practical shall be conducted for 40 marks and shall be computed for 10 marks.



7 CONDONATION OF DEFICIENCY

- 7.1 Deficiency up to five marks can be condoned in any two of the subject (theory or practical) to the best of the advantage of the student for passing the examinations. The deficiency can be condoned in not more than two subjects (theory and practical of the same subject shall be considered as two separate subjects, for the purpose of awarding grace).
- 7.2 The candidate whose distinction or first division is affected by0.01 of CGPA shall be eligible for Condonation of 0.01 CGPA on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor for which the candidate has to apply separately.

8. DURATION FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAM OF STUDY

The duration for the completion of the program shall be fixed as double the actual duration of the program and the students have to pass within the said period.

Ordinance for 2-years Diploma Programme in Pharmacy (Implemented from Academic Year 2005-2006)

TWO YEARS DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES

Rajiv Gandhi Proudyogiki Vishwavidyalaya, Bhopal awards first Diploma in the discipline of Pharmacy as approved by All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi and Pharmacy council of India of two-years duration, hereinafter called 2-YDP, shall be designated as DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY. The studies and examinations of this Diploma programmes shall be on the basis of year system.

RULES FOR ADMISSIONS 2.0

The minimum qualification for admission to the first year of the Diploma programme in Pharmacy (Admission BASED ON STATE LEVEL MERIT) shall be the passing of 12th class or higher examination under (10+2) education scheme with Physics, Chemistry and Biology by obtaining minimum 60% marks collectively in that, conducted by M.P. Board of Secondary Education or an equivalent examination from a recognized Board/University. Candidates for above programmes shall be admitted to the Colleges/Institutions by preparing a Merit List based on the percentage of total marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology in qualifying examination. SC/ST and OBC candidates are not required to obtain minimum 60% marks.

In general, admissions/Readmission to all Diploma Programmes shall be governed by the rules framed by D.T.E. from time to time or any other competent authority of the State Government of Madhya Pradesh/RGPV.

RULES FOR MAXIMUM DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME 3.0

There shall be normally 180 days of teaching in every year. 3.1

A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher classes after the examinations of the previous year are over. However, his/her eligibility shall be 3.2 evaluated only after the result of examination is declared in which he/she had appeared.

The maximum duration for passing all the courses (theory, practicals and industrial Training) of the programme shall be FOUR years for 2 years Diploma 3.3 Programmes, no separate time will given to students for medical or any reason whatsoever. Candidates debarred from examination due to UFM cases or any other reason will also have to clear their Diploma programme in the duration mentioned above. Names of those candidates, who are unable to clear their Diploma programme in the stipulated period will be struck off from the roll list of the college and enrolment of the University.

If such candidate decides again to enroll himself/herself for any of the Diploma programme, he/she will have to seek fresh admission as per the rule mentioned in clause 2.0 above and on seeking a fresh admission, such candidates will not be entitled for any credit or exer from University for the courses passed by them adero at study in the previous Diploma

4.2 Examination: There shall be two examinations, one to examine students for first year Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-I) and the other for students of second year Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-II). Examination shall be both in Theory and Practicals as per scheme of examination in accordance to E.R. 1991 implemented w.e.f. 1992-93 academic session and amended up to as E.R. 1996.

4.3 Each examination shall be held twice in a year. First examination in a year shall be annual examination and the <u>second</u> examination as supplementary examination. Examination shall be of written and Practical (including oral) carrying maximum marks for each part of a subject indicated in Table-III and IV of E.R. 1996.

5.1 ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARING IN THE EXAMINATION FOR DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY PART-I.

Only such candidates who produce certificates from the Head of the Academic Institution, in which he/she has undergone the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I. courses in Proof of his/her having regularly and satisfactorily undergone the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I course, by attending not less than 75% of the classes held both in theory and practicals separately in each subject, shall be eligible for appearing at the examination for Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I.

5.2 ELIGIBILTY FOR APPEARING IN THE EXAMINATION FOR DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY PART-II.

Only such candidates who produce certificates from the Head of the Academic Institution, in which he/she has undergone the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II course in proof of his/her having regularly and satisfactorily undergone Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II course of study, by attending not less than 75% of the classes held both in theory and practicals separately in each subject, shall be eligible for appearing at the Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-II) examination. The sessional work (Term work/Lab. work) must be completed and submitted in the institution at least 15 days before the commencement of theory examination.

5.3 A candidate, who has filled the examination form and deposited the required amount of examination fees and also completed the condition mentioned in Clause 5.1 or 5.2 but could not appear in the full main EXAMINATION due to Ilness of self or due to genuine reasons, maybe allowed to appear in the supplementary examination, if he/she so likes, provided he/she has submitted the medical certificate to the UNIVERSITY through the principal of concerned College/Institution from the authorized medical officer not below the rank of Civil Surgeon or submitted suitable and satisfactory explanation of his/her absence to the principal within 15 days from the date of commencement of main Examination in which the candidate was due to appear. For appearing in the next supplementary Examination, he/she will have to fill up the examination form and deposit prescribed examination fees. Fees already paid by him/her for the earlier year Examination shall not be adjusted/refunded under any circumstances. In such cases, the number of theory papers and practicals in which a candidate can appear shall be limited to a maximum number of theory papers and practicals prescribed in that main examination, in which a candidate could not appear due to reasons mentioned above.

5.4 A candidate who has neither filled the EXAMINATION form nor deposited the required amount of EXAMINATION Fees for the full main Examination and/ or detained due to lack of prescribed attendance or submission of sessionals as prescribed in Clause 5.1 or 5.2 above will have no claim for appearing in the year examination and such candidate will have to seek fresh admission in the same class in the next academic session as a regular candidate if he/she so desires and will have to repeat the course. The student will be granted readmission by the principal of the concerned institution against the seats

earmarked for the repeater candidate, if available.

6 RULES FOR PROMOTION

6.2 ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARING IN DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY PART-III. Shall be as per E.R. 1991 amended up to E.R. 1996, Diploma in Pharmacy Part-III shall consist of a certificate, of having satisfactorily completed course of practical training, as prescribed in chapter-III of E.R. 1996.

6.3 A Candidate, who falls in Theory or Practical examination, shall reappear in such Theory or Practical paper(s) as the case may be.

7 RULES FOR PASSING EXAMINATIONS

7.1 BASIS OF MARKS

7.1.1 The basis of marks obtained in each examination shall be the Scheme of examination of courses for individual years as prescribed by respective Board of Studies and duly approved by Academic Council of University.

7.1.2 For the evaluation of End of the year exam in Practicals, one external examiner shall always be there from outside the College/Institution and

one internal examiner from the College/Institution.

7.1.3 In the schemes of Diploma programmes, where flexibility has been provided to students for selection of courses, once a student in a particular group of electives has made the choice of elective course, it cannot be changed for future study/examination.

8.1 RULES FOR PASS

- 8..1 AWARD OF SESSIONAL MARKS & MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS.
- (a) A regular record of both theory and practical class work and examination conducted in an institution imparting training for the course for Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-I) and Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II shall be maintained.

(b) Twenty marks for each theory subject and twenty marks for each practical shall be allotted for sessional examination.

(c) There shall be at least three periodic sessional examinations, during each academic year. Average of any two best performances, shall form the basis for calculating final sessional marks in individual Theory/Practical.

(d) Sessional marks for practicals shall be

- Actual performance in the sessional examination: 10 marks.
- II. Day to day practical class work assessment: 10 marks.
- (e) Record for Day-to-Day class work assessment of the candidate shall be kept maintained for one more additional academic year, after the completion of main examination of that part.


8.2 MINIMUM MARKS FOR PASSING THE EXAMINATION:

RULES FOR AWARD OF DIVISION

- The division will be awarded as per following scheme.
 - 75% marks or above in aggregate in a single attempt: First Division (a) (Hons.)
 - 60% marks or above in aggregate in a single attempt: First Division. (b)

(Approved on 22 July, 2021)

1. Short Title and Commencement:

These regulations shall be called as "The Revised Regulations for the Master of Pharmacy (M. Pharm.) Degree Program - "Credit Based Semester System (CBSS)". They shall come into effect from the Academic Year 2021-22. The regulations framed are subject to modifications from time to time by the authorities of the university.

2. Minimum qualification for Admission:

- 2.1 Candidate should pass in B. Pharm. Degree examination of an Indian university established by law in India from an institution approved by Pharmacy Council of India and has scored not less than 55 % of the maximum marks (aggregate of 4 years of B. Pharm.). Candidates belonging to SC/ST categories will get relaxation asper the norms of State Government of Madhya Pradesh.
- 2.2. Applicants possessing valid GPAT score shall be given preference over to those candidates who do not possess GPAT score.
- 2.3 The admissions to M. Pharm. course shall be governed by the rules of the Technical Education and Skill Development Department, Government of Madhya Pradesh, Bhopal and/or any other competent authority authorized by the State government of Madhya Pradesh for this purpose.
- 2.4 Every student, selected for admission to post graduate pharmacy program should have obtained registration with the State Pharmacy Council or should obtain the same within one month from the date of his/her admission, failing which the admission of the candidate shall be cancelled.

Note: It is mandatory to submit a migration certificate obtained from the respective university where the candidate had passed his/her qualifying degree (B. Pharm.)

3. Duration of the program:

The program of study for M. Pharm, shall extend over a period of four semesters (two academic years).

4. Medium of instruction and examinations:

Medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

Working days in each semester shall consist of not less than 100 working days. The odd semesters shall be conducted from the month of June/July to November/December and the even semesters shall be conducted from the month of December/January to June / July in every calendar year.

5. Attendance and progress:

A candidate is required to put in at least 80 % attendance in individual courses considering theory and practical separately. The candidate shall complete the prescribed course satisfactorily to be eligible to appear for the respective examinations.

6. Program/Course credit structure:

As per the philosophy of Credit Based Semester System, certain quantum of academic work viz. theory classes, practical classes, seminars, assignments, etc. are measured in terms of credits. On satisfactory completion of the courses, a candidate earns credits. The amount of credit associated with a course is dependent upon the number of hours of instruction per week in that course. Similarly, the credit associated with any of the other academic, co/extra-curricular activities is dependent upon the quantum of work expected to be put in for each of these activities per week/per activity.

6.1 Credit assignment:


6.1.1 Theory and Laboratory courses are broadly classified as Theory and Practical. Theory courses consist of lecture (L) and Practical (P) courses consist of hours spent in the laboratory. Credits (C) for a course is dependent on the number of hours of instruction per week in that course, and is obtained by using a multiplier of one (1) for lecture and a multiplier of half (1/2) for practical (laboratory) hours. Thus, for example, a theory course having four lectures per week throughout the semester carries a credit of 4. Similarly, a practical having four laboratory hours per week throughout semester carries a credit of 2.

6.1.2 The contact hours of seminars, assignments and research work shall be treated as that of practical courses for the purpose of calculating credits. i.e., the contact hours shall be multiplied by 1/2. Similarly, the contact hours of journal club, research work presentations and discussions with the supervisor shall be considered as theory course and multiplied by 1.

7. Minimum credit requirements:







The minimum credit points required for the award of M. Pharm. degree is 95. However, based on the credit points earned by the students under the head of co-curricular activities, a student shall earn a maximum of 100 credit points. These credits are divided into Theory courses, Practical, Seminars, Assignments, Research work, Discussions with the supervisor, Journal club and Co-Curricular activities over the duration of four semesters. The credits are distributed semesterwise. Courses generally progress in sequence, building competencies and their positioning indicates certain academic maturity on the part of the learners. Learners are expected to follow the semester-wise schedule of courses given in the syllabus.

8. Examinations/Assessments

8.1 End Semester Examinations: The End Semester Examinations for each theory and practical course through semesters I to IV shall be conducted by the university except for the subject with asterix symbol (*) in table I and II for which examinations shall be conducted by the subject experts at college level and the marks/grades shall be submitted to the university

8.2 Internal assessment: Continuous mode:

The marks allocated for Continuous mode of Internal Assessment shall be awarded as per the scheme given below.

8.2.1 Sessional Examinations:

Two sessional exams shall be conducted for each theory / practical course as per the schedule fixed by the college(s). The scheme of question paper for theory and practical sessional examinations is given in the table. The average marks of two sessional exams shall be computed for internal assessment as per the requirements given in table.

9. Promotion and award of grades:

A student shall be declared PASS and eligible for getting grade in a course of M. Pharm. programme if he/she secures at least 50 % marks in that particular course including internal assessment.

10. Carry forward of marks:

In case a student fails to secure the minimum 50 % in any Theory or Practical course as specified in 12, then he/she shall reappear for the end semester examination of that course. However, his/her marks of the Internal Assessment shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.

11. Improvement of internal assessment:

A student shall have the opportunity to improve his/her performance only once in the sessional examinations component of the internal assessment. The re-conduct of the sessional exam shall be completed before the commencement of next end semester theory examinations.

12. Re-examination of end semester examinations:

13. Allowed to keep terms (ATKT):

No student shall be admitted to any examination unless he/she fulfills the norms given in 6, i.e 80 % attendance in theory and practical's. ATKT rules are applicable as follows:

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of I and II semesters till the III semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of IV semester until all the Courses of I, II and III semesters are successfully completed.

A student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of I to IV semesters within the stipulated time period as per the norms.

Note: Grade AB should be considered as failed and treated as one head for deciding ATKT. Such rules are also applicable for those students who fail to register for examination(s) of any course in any semester.

14. Grading of performances:

Letter grades and grade points allocations:

Based on the performances, each student shall be awarded a final letter grade at the end of the semester for each course. The letter grades and their corresponding grade points are given in Table - 4

A learner who remains absent for any end semester examination shall be assigned a letter grade of AB and a corresponding grade point of zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course.

15. The Semester grade point average (SGPA):

The performance of a student in a semester is indicated by a number called 'Semester Grade Point Average' (SGPA). The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses by the student during the semester. For example, if a student takes five courses (Theory/Practical) in a semester with credits C1, C2, C3 and C4 and the student's grade points in these courses are G1, G2, G3 and G4, respectively, and then students' SGPA is equal to:

The SGPA is calculated to two decimal points. It should be noted that, the SGPA for any semester shall take into consideration the F and ABS grade awarded in that semester. For example, if a learner has a F or ABS grade in course 4, the SGPA shall then be computed as:


16. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

The CGPA is calculated with the SGPA of all the IV semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade report card/final transcript showing the grades of all IV semesters and their courses. The CGPA shall reflect the failed status in case of F grade(s), till the course(s) is/are passed. When the course(s) is/are passed by obtaining a pass grade on subsequent examination(s) the CGPA shall only reflect the new grade and not the fail grades earned earlier. The CGPA is calculated as:

17. Declaration of class:

The class shall be awarded on the basis of CGPA as follows:

First class with distinction: CGPA of. 7.50 and above

First class: CGPA of. 6.00 to 7.49

Second class: CGPA of. 5.00 to 5.99.

18. Project work:

All the students shall undertake a project under the supervision of a teacher in Semester III and IV and submit a report. One copy of the project report shall be submitted to University.

The external examiner appointed by the University shall evaluate the project at the time of the Practical examinations in consultation with internal.

19. Award of Ranks:

Ranks and Medals shall be awarded on the basis of final CGPA. However, candidates who fail in one or more courses during the M. Pharm program shall not be eligible for award of ranks. Moreover, the candidates should have completed the M. Pharm program in minimum prescribed number of years, (two years) for the award of Ranks.

20. Award of degree:

Candidates who fulfill the requirements mentioned above shall be eligible for award of degree during the ensuing convocation.

21. Duration for completion of the program of study:

The duration for the completion of the program shall be fixed as double the actual duration of the program and the students have to pass within the said period, otherwise they have to get fresh Registration.



Ordinance for Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D) & Doctor of Pharmacy (PostBaccalaureate)

(Annual System) (Approved on August, 2018)

Pharm. D. is a six years programme of pharmacy profession which includes five years of academic studies and one year of internship in the hospital after 10+2 examination (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics/Biology) while Pharm. D (post Baccalaureate) is a three years programme of pharmacy profession which includes two years of academic studies and one year of internship in the hospital after B.Pharm.

Institute /Colleges wishes to start Pharm. D. or/and Pharm D (PB) must follow the norms prescribed by the Pharmacy Council of India and should have prior permission to start the course from the Pharmacy Council of India.

1.1 For Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D)

The duration of the course of instruction leading to the award of Degree of Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D) shall be six academic years (five years of study and one year of internship or residency). Each year shall have actual teaching for a minimum of 200 days excluding admission, preparation and examination days.

The examination shall be held in six Parts i.e. Part - I at the end of the course of First Year, Part - II at the end of the course of Second year and so on, ordinarily in themonth of May/June on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and notified by the Controller of Examinations.

1.2 For Doctor of Pharmacy (Post Baccalaureate):

The duration of the course shall be of three academic years (two years of study and one year internship or residency) full time with each academic year spread over a period of not less than two hundred working days. The period of three years duration is divided into two phases –

Phase I - Consisting of First and Second Academic year.

Phase II - Consisting of Internship or residency training during third year involving posting in specialty units. It is a phase of training wherein a student is exposed to actual pharmacy practice or clinical pharmacy services, and acquires skill under supervision so that he or she may become capable of functioning independently.

1.3 Theexaminationshallbeheldtwiceinayear, one Annual at the end of the sessioni.e. in May/June and the other Supplementary in November/December on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and notified by the Controller of Examinations.

1.4 The period of six years duration shall be divided into twophases:-

Phase-I shall comprise First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth academicyear.

Phase-II shall comprise internship or residency training during sixth year involving posting in specialty units. It is a phase of training wherein a student is exposed to actual pharmacy practice or clinical pharmacy services and acquires skill under the supervision of a teacher appointed by the Principal of the College/Institute so that he or she may become capable of functioning independently.

- 2.1 A person who attains the age of 17 years on or before 31stDecember of the year of admission to the course and has passed any of the following examinations, shall be eligible for admission to the Pharm. Decourse:-
 - 10+2 examination with atleast five subjects including English, Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects alongwith one of the subjects of Mathematics and Biology.
 - (ii) A pass in D.Pharm. course from an Institution approved by the Pharmacy Councilof India under Section 12 of the PharmacyAct;
 - (iii) Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the aboveexaminations.

Provided that the National Reservation policy as applicable to the self-financing institutions shall be followed.

2.2 For Doctor of Pharmacy (Post Baccalaureate):

A pass in B.Pharm.course from an Institution/College approved by the Pharmacy Council of India.

the tables below. The number of hours in a week, devoted to each subject for its teaching in
theory, practical and tutorial shall not be less than that noted against it in columns (3),(4) and
(5) below.



- 4. The examination of Part-I/II/III/IV/V shall be open to astudent:-
- (a) Has passed the requisite qualifying examination as faid down in Clause 2, if he/she is a candidate for Part-I examination or has passed the preceding year examination if he is a candidate for the second/third/fourth/fifth year examination, as the case may be, or is covered under Clause 4.2 below.
- (b) Has his/her name submitted to the Controller of Examinations by the Principal of Pharmacy College and produces the following certificates signed by the Principal of the College:-
 - (i) good character;
 - (ii) of having remained on the rolls of the College of Pharmacy for the academic year preceding the examination;
 - (iii) Of having attended not less than 80% of the classes held both in theory and in practical separately in each of thesubjects.

Provided that the candidate who has not attended the requisite number of classes for any subject(s) will be eligible to take examination in the remaining subject(s). In exceptional cases, the Principal of the College/Institute may condone shortage of attendance upto 10% of the total lectures delivered in each paper, on merit of each case.

Explanation: -

Forthe purpose of counting of the last date when the classes shall break up for the preparatory holidays, first day of the commencement of the examination will apply to all yearly examinations and classes for all the parts will have the preparatory holidays from the same date i.e. 10 days before the date on which the first examination of any Partcommences.

4.1. A candidate who has failed in not more than two paper(s) of I/ III/IV/V shall be promoted provisionally to the Part-II/ III/IV/ V/VI respectively, as the case may be as mentioned below:-



- 4.2. A candidate who has failed in one or more paper(s) or having been eligible fails to appear in an examination shall be allowed two additional chances only, on the recommendation of the Principal of the Institute, to pass the examination subject to Clause 12 below. Such a candidate may be exempted from re-appearing in the paper/ practicals in which he/she may have obtained at least 50%marks.
- 4.3. A student who fails in theory or practical examination of a paper shall re-appear both in theory and practical of the same paper. However, if the candidate fails in more than two papers in the main examination, he/she shall not be allowed to continue his/her studies in the next higher class until he/she has fulfilled the requirement of promotion to the next higher class. Theory and Practical of a particular subject are considered as individual subjects for the purpose of passcriteria.
- 5. The examination shall be held according to the Scheme of Examinations and Syllabus prescribed by the Academic Council of the University and should be in accordance with PCI syllabus. A candidate who has re-appeared in an examination or having been eligible fails to appear in the examination shall take the examinationsecordingto syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students Provided that the syllabus for the candidates of supplementary examinations shall be the same aswasinforce in the last annual examination.
- 6.1. 30 marks for each theory and 30 marks for each practical subject out of 100 marks in each shall be allotted as sessional marks. A regular record of both theory and practical class work and examinations conducted in an institution imparting training for Pharm D. course, shall be maintained for each student in theinstitution.
- 6.2. The sessional marks in practicals shall be allotted on the followingbasis:-
 - (i) Actual performance in the sessional examination.
 - (ii) Day-to-day assessment in the practical class work, promptness, viva-voce record maintenance, etc.
- 6.3 There shall be three periodic sessional examinations during each academic year and the highest aggregate of any two sessional examinations shall form the basis of calculating sessionalmarks.




- 7.1 Every student shall be posted in recognized Hospital as per Pharm.D regulation of Pharmacy council of India, New Delhiand approved by the Principal of the College/Institute for a period of not less than 50 hours of Practical Training to be covered each in Second, Third and Fourth year course. Each student shall submit Practical Training Report duly certified by the concerned teacher and the Principal of the College/Institution to the Controller of the Examinations within a period of 30 days of completion of practical training.
- 7.2 In the Fifth year, every student shall spend half a day in the morning hours attending ward rounds on daily basis as a part of clerkship. Theory teaching will be scheduled in the afternoon. Oral examination shall be conducted after the completion of clerkship of students. An external and an internal examiner will evaluate the student. Students shall be asked to present the allotted medical cases followed by discussion. Students' capabilities in delivering clinical pharmacy services, pharmaceutical care, planning and knowledge of therapeutics shall beassessed.
- 8.1 The Project Topic related to the Pharmacy practice in community, hospital and clinical setup shall be approved by the Principal of the College/Institute and announced to students within one month of commencement of the Fifth yearclasses. Project work shall be carried out under the supervision of a teacher and shall be presented in a written report and as a seminar at the end of the year. The external and the internal examiners shall do the assessment of the Project work
- 8.2 The Project Topic shall also be approved by the Institutional Ethics Committee. The students shall present at least three seminars one in the beginning, one at middle and oneat the end of the Project work and two page write-up of the Project indicating title, objectives, methodology anticipated benefits and references shall be submitted to the Principal ofthe College/Institute. The average of best two seminarsshallbeforwardedtotheUniversity with marks of other subjects. The studentshallsubmithis/her final Project Report to the Controller of Examinations at least one month prior to the commencement of annual examination. The Project Report will include a certificate issued by the concerned teacher duly countersigned by the Principal of the College/Institute to this effect that the Project Work carried out by the candidate is original and not similar to one which has already been submitted by other candidate(s).
- 8.3 Evaluation of the project work shall be done on the following items: (a) Write-up of the seminar (b) Presentation of work (c) Communication skills (d) Question and answer skills, as per marks allotted in the Scheme of Examination and Syllabus for thecourse.
 Explanation.— For the purposes of differentiation in the evaluation in case of topic being the same for the group of students, the same shall be done based on item numbers (b), (c) and (d) mentioned above.
- 9.1 Every candidate shall be required, after passing the fifth year of Pharm.D examination, to undergo compulsory rotational internship for a period of twelve months, to the satisfaction of the Principal of the College/Institute concerned and to submit Training Report to the

University at the end of internship by 30thJune of the year for evaluation. Internship including postings in specialty units. Student should independently provide the clinical pharmacy services to the allottedwards:

- (i) Six months in General Medicine Department

- 9.2 (i) The intern student shall maintain a record of work which is to be verified and certified by the preceptor (teacher practitioner) under whom he works. Apartfrom scrutinyofthe record of work, assessment and evaluation of trainingshallbeundertakenby an objective approach using situation tests in knowledge skillsand attitude during and at the end of the training by the preceptor. Based on thescrutiny oftherecord of work and evaluation of training, the PrincipaloftheCollege/InstituteshallissueCertificateofsatisfactory completionof training, following which the University shall declare him eligible for the award ofdegree.
 - (ii) Satisfactory completion of internship shall be determined on the basis of the following:-
 - (1) Proficiency of knowledge required for each case management SCORE0-5;
 - (2) The competency in skills expected for providing Clinical PharmacyServices SCORE0-5
 - Responsibility.punctuality,workupofease,involvementinpatienteare SCORE0-5;
 - (4) Ability to work in a team (Behavior with other healthcareprofessionalsincluding medical doctors, nursing staff and colleagues). SCORE0-5;
 - (5) Initiative, participation in discussions, research aptitude. SCORE0-5;



PART - I - DEFINITIONS.

1. In this Ordinance and in all Ordinance and Regulations laying down conditions for appearing at an examination of the University for a degree or a diploma, either generally or for a particular examination, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context:-

"Regular candidates" means a person who has prosecuted a regular course of study in a (1) University Teaching Department School of studies or college and seeks admission to an

examination of the University as such.

"Ex-student candidate" means a person who was admitted to an examination as a regular (ii) candidate and was not declared successful thereat or was not able to appear in the examination though admission card was correctly issued to him by the University and seeks admission again to the said examination.

"A Regular Course of study" means a candidate appearing as regular student for any examination (iii) are required to attend seventy five percent of lectures delivered and of the practical classes held separately in each subject of the course of study.

NOTE: In this Ordinance, unless provided otherwise, lectures, shall include tutorials and seminars.

"Forwarding Officer" means in case of an ex-student candidate, the principal of the college where the (iii) candidate has prosecuted a regular course of study.

"Attested" means attested by the Principal, or by any authority nominated by the Principal of the (iv) College or University.

PART- II

Admission of regular candidate to an examination of the University.

2.1 No regular candidate shall be admitted to an examination of the university unless he/she :-

2.1.1 Has been enrolled as a student in a university Teaching Department, School of Studies or colleges in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance.

Possesses the minimum academic qualification for admission to the examination to which he seeks admission and has prosecuted a regular course of study for that examination.

A Regular candidate migrating from another University or Board of Secondary Education sends 2.1.3 his/her original migration certificate with his/her enrolment application form on the date prescribed in the Ordinance for enrolment of students and their admission to course of study together with the migration and immigration fees as prescribed by the University.

The Controller Exam may on the specific recommendation of the Principal, and if he is satisfied that an admission card has been lost or destroyed, grant a duplicate admission card on payment of further fees as prescribed by University such card shall show in a prominent place the word

duplicate.

2.1.5 Where a candidate offers an additional subject paper for an Examination in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance relating to the examination, the minimum attendance requirement shall apply equally in case of such additional subject/paper.

In computing the attendance for fulfillment of the condition regarding prosecution of a regular course of

study :-

3.

3.1 Attendance at lectures delivered and practicals, if any, held during the academic session shall be counted.

3.2 Attendance at any lecture delivered or in practical held within fourteen days preceding the first day of written examination which shall be treated as preparation leave, shall not be counted.

3.3 Attendance kept by a regular candidate in higher class shall be counted towards the percentage of attendance for the examination of lower class to which he may revert as a result of his failure to pass in the examination.

3.4 Attendance at NCC/NSS Camp during the session shall be taken as full attendance at

lectures/practicals on each such day camp and the day of journey to such camp.

3.5 Participation as a member of a University/College team in any Inter-University or Inter-Collegiate Competition shall be taken as full attendance on the days of such competition and the days of journey for participating therein.

3.6 For special reasons such as prolonged illness deficiency in percentage of attendance not exceeding fifteen percent i.e. upto ten percent and a further five percent of the total number of lectures delivered and practical held in each subject may be condoned by the Principal and by the

Kulpati respectively.

4. Except as otherwise provided, a regular candidate for an examination shall on or before the last date

notified by the RGPV :-

4.1 Submit an application for an admission to the examination in the prescribed form duly affix his/her latest passport size photograph at the appropriate place, through the principal of the college/Head of the University Teaching Department or School of Studies indicating the subject or subjects in which he desires to present himself for the examination.

4.2 Pay along with the application, the fee prescribed for the examination concerned.

4.3.1 Application submitted by regular candidate together with the examination fee shall be forwarded by the Principal of the College/Head of the University Teaching Department of School of Studies so as to reach the university on or before the last date prescribed for the purpose by the University.


4.3.2 In case of each application, the Principal of the College/Head of the University Teaching

Department or School of Studies shall certify that the candidate:

4.3.2 (a) Possesses the minimum academic qualification for appearing at the examination to which he/she seeks admission.

4.3.2 (b) Is of good conduct.

4.3.3 The Principal of a college or the Head of University Teaching Department or School of Studies may detain a regular candidate from taking an examination if he does not pay outstanding college dues, or does not return the college property and all the articles and uniform issued to him for sports or NCC or does not pay the cost thereof in case of loss, by 15 days preceding the examination or if the conduct of the student has been unsatisfactory between the time of submission his application form to the University for admission to the examination and the date of the commencement of the examination.









PART-III

Admission of an Ex-Student candidate to an examination of the University.

5.1 No ex-student candidate shall be admitted to an examination of the University unless he submits with his application for appearing in the examination :-5.1.1 The statement of marks (in original) obtained by him at the said examination issued by the University

together with an attested copy thereof, or

- In case he was duly admitted to the said examination as a regular candidate but could not appear there at a certificate from the Principal of the college last attended by him showing the year, the roll number and the examination to which he was admitted as a regular candidate.
- An ex-student candidate for an exam shall:
 - 6.1 Submit through the forwarding officer i.e the Principal of the college wherein he has prosecuted a regular course of study, an application for admission to the examination in the prescribed form on or before the last date notified by the University and specify therein :-

(a) Whether he is a candidate for the examination entitled.

(b) The subject paper or subjects/papers in which he desires to present himself for the examination.

6.2 Submit with his application evidence of having been admitted to the examination earlier as required in paragraph 5.1 above.

6.3 Attach with his application for admission to the examination, his/her latest passport size photograph

duly attested by the forwarding officer.

6.4 Pay the fee prescribed for the examination. Fees shall be paid through crossed bank draft drawn in favour of the Registrar of the University or in any other manner prescribed by the University.

7.1 An Ex-student candidate shall offer the subjects/papers which he had previously offered as a regular candidate unless on account of a change in the scheme of examination the subject/paper offered by him earlier ceases to be a part of the scheme of examination or syllabus of the examination and he is permitted by the University to offer instead a different subject or paper.

An ex-student candidate will be required to appear in the examination in accordance with the syllabus specifying the scope of studies in different subjects in force in the University.

Every ex-student candidate shall appear at the examination center at which the regular candidates from 8. the college in which he has prosecuted a regular course of study shall be appearing.

PART-IV

9. General conditions applicable to all candidates.

9.1.1 No candidate shall appear in more than one degree examination or for the Master's degree in one and the same year.

For a candidate who has passed a part of the Bachelor's degree examination or a part of a Master's 10. degree examination of another University may, on the recommendation of Chairman Board of studies concern and Dean of the faculty concern be admitted with the permission of Kulpati to the next higher examination of the University for the degree concerned provided the course offered by the candidate at such other University is equivalent to the course of the University for the corresponding examination.

No person who has been expelled or rusticated from any college or University or has been debarred in 11. appearing at a University examination shall be admitted to any examination during the period for which

the sentence is in operation.

- 12.1 An application for admission to an examination received by the University after the last date notified by the University, after the last date notified by the University but not later than fifteen days after such last date may be entertained on payment of a late fee prescribed by the university but not later than the fifteen days before the commencement of examination.
- 12.2 Notwithstanding anything contained in the ordinances relating to admission of candidates to an examination of the University, the Kulapti may, in special cases to an examination is not due to lack of diligence on the part of the candidate and that it would be a great hardship to the candidate if his application is rejected, allow an application which is otherwise complete in all respects to be entertained with the late fee prescribed by the University even though the same is received after the expiry of the period of fifteen days mentioned in the forgoing paragraph.

13.1 The University shall issue an admission card in favour of a candidate, if :-

- 13.1.1 The application of the candidate is complete in all respect in accordance with the provisions applicable to him and in order.
- 13.1.2 The candidate is eligible for admission to examination, and the fees as prescribed have been paid by the candidate.
- 13.2 Where the practical examination is held earlier than the examination in theory paper, a candidate shall not be deemed to have been admitted to the examination until he is issued an admission card for appearing in the examination.
- 13.3 The admission card issued in favour of a candidate to appear at an examination may be withdrawn if it is found that:-
 - 13.3.1 The admission card was issued or permission was given through mistake or the candidate was not eligible to appear in the examination.
 - 13.3.2 Any of the particulars given or document submitted by the candidate in or with the application for enrollment admission to a college, teaching department or School of Studies or an examination is false or incorrect.
- 13.4 The Registrar may on the recommendation of Principal/Superintendent Exam concern that an admission card has been lost or destroyed, grant a permission to issue a duplicate admission card on payment of a further fees prescribed by the University. Such card shall shown in a prominent place the word "Duplicate".
- 14.1 The Superintendent of examination Centre shall identify the prohibited area refered to in Section 3(c) of the Madhya Pradesh Recognized Examination Act, 1937 (as amended from time to time) by visible signs, and it shall be produced. A candidate shall produce his admission card whenever required by the Superintendent or the invigilator. The Superintendent and invigilators shall have all powers to exercise check on unfair means including those of search and seizure.
- 14.2 A candidate shall not be entered in to the Examination hall unless he produces the admission card before the Superintendent of the Examination Centre or the invigilator or satisfies such officers that it shall be produced. A candidate shall produce his admission card whenever required by the Superintendent or the invigilator. The Superintendent and Invigilator shall have all powers to exercise check on unfair means including those of search and seizure.
- 15.1 In the Examination Hall the candidate shall be under the disciplinary control of the Superintendent of the center and he shall obey his instructions. In the event of a candidate disobeying the instructions of the Superintendent or his undisciplined conduct or insolent behavior towards the Superintendent or any invigilator, candidate may be excluded from that days examination and if he persists in misbehavior he may be excluded from the rest of the examination by the Superintendent of the center.
- 15.2 If a candidate acts in a violent manner or uses force or makes a display of force towards the Superintendent or any invigilator at the centre or in its precincts endarging the personal safety or either



of them or acts in a manner likely to the authorities in the discharges of their duties, the Superintendent may expel the candidate from the center and he may take police help.

If a candidate brings any dangerous weapon within the precincts of the examination centre he may be 15.3 expelled from the centre and/or handed over to the police by the Superintendent.

15.4 A candidate expelled on any of the grounds mentioned in (15.2) or (15.3) above will not be allowed to appear in the subsequent papers.

In every case where action is taken by the Superintendent under (15.1), (15.2) or (15.3) above a full 15.5 report shall be sent to the University and the Executive Council may according to the gravity of the offence further punish a candidate by canceling his examination and/or debarring him from appearing at the examination of the University for one or more years after giving the candidate an opportunity to show cause and considering any explanation submitted by the candidate.

15.6.1 If a candidate is found guilty of using or attempting to use or having used unfair means at an examination such as copying from some book or note or from the answer of some other candidate or helping or receiving help from any other candidate or keeping with him in the examination hall material connected with the examination or failure of an examinee to handover his answer-book to Superintendent/invigilator or taking away his own answer book, walks out of the examination hall or in any other manner whatsoever, the Executive Council or the Committee appointed for the purpose by the Executive Council may cancel his nature of the offence.

15.6.2 The Executive Council may cancel the examination of a candidate and/or debar him from appearing at an examination of the Vishwavidyalaya for one or more years, if it is discovered afterwards that the candidate was in any manner guilty of misconduct in connection with his examination and/or was instrumental in or has abetted the tampering of Vishwavidyalaya records including the answer books, marks-sheet, result charts, degree, diplomas and the like.

15.6.3 The Executive Council may cancel the examination of a candidate and/or debar him from appearing at an examination of the Vishwavidyalaya for one or more years, if it is discovered afterwards that candidate has obtained admission to the examination by misrepresenting facts or by submitting false or forged certificate/documents.

15.6.4 When the University intends to award any of the aforesaid penalties under clause (15.6.1), (15.6.2) or (15.6.3) above it shall give the candidate concerned an opportunity to show cause in writing within fifteen days of the issue of such "show-cause" letter as to why the proposed penalty may not be imposed on him and shall consider the explanation if any, if filed within the specified time, before awarding the penalty.

15.6.5 A list of such candidates so disqualified shall be circulated to all the universities in India requesting them not to admit the students during the period of their disqualification.


15.7 The action taken by the university referred to above, will be over and above the action which the police might take under the provisions of the M.P. recognized Examinations Act, 1937 (as amended from time to time).

A candidate who, due to sickness is unable to present himself/herself at an examination shall be receive 16.1 a refund of fees but in case it is satisfied about the genuineness, or merit of it, the examination fee and statement of marks fees can be adjusted towards the immediately next examination after deduction of an amount of Rs. 200/- .

Application for such adjustment from a candidate accompanied by a Medical Certificate of illness if 16.2 applicable, must be sent so as to reach the Registrar not earlier than and not later than 30 days from the date of commencement of the Examination at which the candidate was to appear, provided that the medical certificate should be issued by the competent medical officer of Govt. Hospital duly countersigned by the Civil Surgeon.







- 16.4 Examination and other fees of a candidate whose application for appearing at an examination has been rejected for some reason, or who could not furnish his from within the prescribed date, necessary fees having been paid in University accounts, may be refunded after deduction of Rs. 200/-.
- 16.5 The examination and marks fee of a candidate who dies before appearing at the examination may be refunded in full of his guardian or his successor.
- 16.6 The entire fees paid by a candidate whose application for appearing at an examination is cancelled an account of producing fraudulent documents or giving false particulars shall stand forfeited.
 - 17.1 Any candidate, who has appeared at an examination conducted by the University, may apply to the Registrar for the security of his marks in the written papers in any subject and rechecking of his result, Such application must be made so as to reach the Registrar within 20 days after the declaration of result.
 - 17.2 Such application must be accompanied by fees as prescribed by the University.
 - 17.3 The result of the scrutiny shall be communicated to the candidate.
 - 17.4 If as a result of scrutiny it is found that the examinee should be declared a shaving passed or placed in a higher division the result of the candidate shall be revised accordingly.
 - 18. A candidate whose result has been declared may apply to the Registrar for revolution of any of his answer books in the prescribed form within 20 days of the declaration of his result for the revolution any of his answer book.
 - Provided that no candidate shall be allowed to have the answer books of more then two papers revalued. Provided also that no revaluation shall be allowed in case of scripts of practicals, field work, sessional work tests and thesis submitted in due of paper at the examination.
 - 19. A candidate who has passed any final degree examination may, after the declaration of his result and before the date of the next convocation apply to the Registrar for a Provisional Certificate of passing the examination of the University. Such application shall be accompanied by a fee as prescribed by University.
- 20. No person who is under sentence of expulsion or rustication from a University Teaching Department School of Studies or college or from the University or is debarred from appearing at examination of the University for any period of time shall be granted a Migration Certificate during the period for which the sentence is in operation.
- Duplicate copies of the following certificates shall be granted on payment of the fee prescribed by the University, viz:-
 - (i) Marks list
 - (ii) Migration Certificate.
 - (iii) Provisional Certificate.

Provided further that duplicate copy of Migration Certificate shall not be granted except in cases in which the Registrar is satisfied by the production of an affidavit on a stamped paper of proper value required by Law for the time being in force that the applicant has not utilized the Original Migration Certificate for appearing at an examination and has lost the same or that the same has been destroyed and that the applicant has real need for a duplicate.

22. Duplicate of University Degrees, Diplomas shall not be granted except incases in which the Kulpati is satisfied by the production of an affidavit on a stamped paper of proper value required by Law for the time being in force, that the applicant has lost his degree/diploma or that it has been destroyed, and the applicant has real need for a duplicate. In such cases, a duplicate of the degree/diploma may be granted on receipt of a fee as prescribed by the University.
