Librarian - A librarian is responsible for gathering, arranging, and distributing library materials.






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10. Creation of the success stories of the students and alumni.

Object

PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION:

A survey was conducted by our students of IIP during the camp, for determining the status of health condition and awareness of the villagers.

Survey: A health checkup of 218 Patients was conducted. They stated:

- Majority of the patients were above 55 years. Approx. 60-hypertensive patients;
- 45 Patients are found to diabetic.
- 87 school children were checked for common ailments like cough, cold, poor appetite.

In 2023-24, we have continued with our in-house college management system (CMS II) and implemented it in library and academic section.

1. Administration:
