### PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION:

- Counseled the students and parents on balanced diet and protein rich diet for ensuring good growth and development of children...
- 4. Dispensed & distributed medicine for common ailments
- 5. Shared health-related information

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The session throwns parted with hands on experience of 31) printing machine. Students cine on 3D Panter, and they are very surprised to see working IQAC
















