Dr. Dixit read out minutes of meeting of 4<sup>th</sup> IQAC meeting and they were unanimously accepted by all the members.

1. Academic Calendar: Dr. Nadeem Farooqui discussed about the academic calendar and progress of academic session (commencement: July) starting with the preparation of lesson plan, lectures / practical conducted, students' attendance. The First sessional would be planned as per academic calendar and syllabus completion. Further to it, he discussed on the activities to be conducted.
2. Mr. Darshan Jamidar updated on the planning for the industrial visits for the session. He had initiated discussion with some pharma companies for the visit.
3. Dr. Rekha Bisht discussed about the SIGs planned for the session for all batches of B. Pharm students. She proposed on introducing new SIGs for the students of B. Pharm. III year namely QMS.
4. Dr Mishra mentioned about the conduction of personality development classes for the final year by **CDC cell** to prepare students for the upcoming placements. He further stated that a stringent follow up should be taken for the regular classes for communication and English for other batches .
5. IQAC instructed to conduct the crash course for the preparation of **GPAT** for the final year students on every working Saturday.
6. IQAC head suggested calling for proposals from students and faculties for the **institutional innovation cell**.



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7. The Training and implementation on ERP (Master Cloud based ERP) was discussed by IQAC and regular follow ups to be taken by all HODs.
8. Dr Mishra sir suggested that Up gradation of labs as per industrial needs, is required. (Computer lab, Microbiology Lab, Social Pharmacy lab, instrument lab and Machine room).
9. Dr. D. K. Mishra encouraged and emphasized on the requirement of research papers to be published and patents by faculty members and M. Pharm. Students.
10. Dr. D. K. Mishra sir stated that class coordinators should identify slow learning students on the basis of 1<sup>st</sup> sessional exams and accordingly plan special classes. The schedule should be shared with academic in charge for approval and faculties to be assigned the subjects.
11. IQAC coordinator proposed that a committee should be constituted to review and revise the scoring level of COPO attainment in lieu of exams being shifted from online to offline mode. Members of committee were representative from academic, exam, HODS and placement.
12. As per discussion with committee members final submission of SSR is proposed to be on 15<sup>th</sup> September keeping in the mind, the time given by NAAC after IIQA submission.
13. IQAC proposed shifting of student feedback system from offline mode to online mode and directed to take necessary action.

2. Revision of composition of IQAC for academic year 2022-23 as per guidelines of NAAC was done; Dr. Rupesh Gautam was unanimously nominated and selected as the coordinator of IQAC coordinator.

Dr. Rupesh Gautam briefed the points of previous IQAC meeting held and they were unanimously accepted by all the members.

3. Shri Arun S Bhatnagar sir (Group Advisor IIST-IIP- IIMR) proposed The Strategic Plan 2023-28. The primary objective is to establish IIP as a center of academic excellence by providing a forum to our students, to achieve their fullest potential in all aspects of their persona by recognizing their inherent strength. We will work towards continuous improvement on quality of education and deliver excellence in all our pursuits with focus on research, best



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practices in teaching, exceptional education and technical knowhow, ethical behavior and building a team of excellent faculty. We intent to develop a professional eco-system to enhance their technical competence in their related programs.

The Strategic Plan 2023-28 Proposal would be forwarded to all stakeholders for their valuable input and suggestion.

4. Mrs. Nayany Sharma informed about ERP training for LMS module to all the coordinators and emphasized on strict adherence on taking students' attendance.
5. CRC team updated the members of IQAC about the conduction of Crash course for preparation and fine tuning of students for interviews and counter check resume of students in preparation for the placements.
6. Dr. D.K Mishra updated about the new integrated P. G. course Pharm D, which was applied for in Feb. 2023, and as per the protocols of PCI, it is expected that an inspection by PCI team would be conducted in few months. 




