As per the Research Policy implemented, *financial rewards* of Approx. More than one Lac has been awarded to Faculties and students.



Publication of several patents, collaborations through MoUs with various educational and skill imparting institutions for student training, industrial based project, tie-up with industries for internship are continuously being worked on. Faculties are encouraged to enrol for Ph.D.

- **6. Inception of NSS Unit** at the Institution and conduct of extension activities under its flagship to increase the social belonging of the students and to inculcate professional ethics like Health Check Up Camp, Blood Donation, Road Safety Awareness.
